MONEY RETURNED TO TAXPAYER

In a final accounting of the building project by the Library's Financial Secretary, Irene D'Agostino, and our accountant, Henry Graber, CPA, of Graber and Co., Garden City, the amount of **\$5,546.35**, money not expended on the building project, will be used to reduce the amount of the bond approved by taxpayers in 1986. In the 1992-93 fiscal year, the bond cost the taxpayers \$108,695 (out of the School District budget of \$5,291,167), or 3.81 per \$1000 of assessed valuation. In the year 1993-94, this cost will be \$105,470. The amount will decrease every year thereafter.

The Library does not have power to borrow under State Law. Therefore, the Bond which was approved in 1986 was borrowed by the School District for the Library. The payment on the bond appears every year in the School Budget.

The Library's Annual Operating Budget is entirely separate from the Annual School Budget. See the following page for information about the Library's current financial status.

VOTE AT LIBRARY

Saturday, April 24, 1993 2:00 P.M. - 8:00 P.M.

All Annual Votes on Library issues will be held in the Library from now on. Montauk has always been one of the few School District Public Libraries that did not hold the vote in its own building. Now that we have the space, voters will vote on the Library in the Library.

This year the Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that there will be **no request for a budget increase!!** Projections for the past year's budget proved to be on target. In accordance with New York State Education Law, there is no requirement for a vote if there is no request for an increase in the library budget. Therefore no public hearing is scheduled. Information about the Library's annual operating budget is available at all times at the Library. All trustee meetings are open to the public as well. Dates and times of the monthly meeting are available by calling the Library, and are posted in The East Hampton Star.

What the qualified, registered voter **will** vote on this year are two trustee positions. The five- year terms currently held by Barbara Borth and John Keeshan are up for election this year. Both Mrs. Borth and Mr. Keeshan are seeking re-election. Those interested in seeking a trustee position should obtain a petition from Ann Peterson at the Montauk School. Petitions must be returned by March 24th.

The April monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees will be held at 7:00 PM on the 15th. Any questions you might have about the vote or the operating budget can be addressed to the trustees. You are welcome to stay for the meeting afterwards.



Projected Balance \$ 13,400 The Capital Account is held as a reserve fund for Capital Improvements to the Library. It is accrued by putting over any funds left from the previous year's Operating Budget, in accordance with State Education Law. Since the Library does not have the power to borrow it must maintain a balance in case of major problems.

THE SPECIAL FUND

The current balance of the Special Fund is \$35,500. This fund is used for special purchases of furnishings and collections and an endowment fund. It is accrued solely through donations.



READING GROUP

The Reading Group meets monthly on Sundays at noon in the Library to discuss books selected at the previous meeting. This substantial donation was made with funds remaining from the nursery school which closed in 1984, because so many of its former students would be able to benefit from such a gift. The Montauk Community Cooperative Nursery School, which was founded in 1969 by Betsy Friend and a group of moms, was held in the Community Church. Pat Smyth, the school's last teacher, reflects that the school was a real community effort, with dads and moms helping out, and visits to local businesses one of the main activities. It was Montauk's first pre-school, and is fondly remembered by many of its alumni who now have businesses and children of their own. What a wonderful donation!
