- Choose your count site: Find a place in your backyard, on the beach, or on a trail. You can stand still or take a walk and see what species you might encounter.
- Count all the birds you see at your count site: For each species, keep track of the maximum number of individuals visible at a time. The goal is to never count the same bird more than once. For any birds you cannot identify, take notes on the back of the page of their size, color, behavior, and what they sound like. Repeat for a second session. Mark the date, time, and location.
- Report your counts: Return a copy of your checklist to the library within 2 weeks of your count and receive a Montauk Library Bird Club button. Students in grades 7+ can receive 2 hours of community service credits for completing two 15-minute counts. If you require community service hours, please see the children's department.
