Observe and learn to identify birds throughout a variety of habitats, including woodland, grassland, wetland, and ocean species of Shadmoor State Park.




The walk will be a moderate-paced hike along well-maintained trails. Parking is free.

Registration is required. Additional details will be sent to registrants.



This easy-to-use guide gives seasonal information for both popular birding sites and those off the beaten path.


